- + Name, address, phone number, e-mail, school and grade must appear on a cover sheet, not on the essay
- + Must contain personal experiences and examples of community commitment
- + You cannot apply if you are a previous winner of this award
- + Submission deadline: Friday, July 31st, 2009 by 7pm

"Kristin's Courage" **Women's Health Awareness Scholarship**

To celebrate Miss Vergas 1987, Kristin Sonnenberg Stinar's successful defeat of life threatening cancer, The Miss Vergas Scholarship Committee will award a \$300 educational scholarship called "Kristin's Courage." To apply for the Women's Health Awareness Scholarship, the contestant must research and write an essay concerning a woman's health concern. The following criteria will be applied:

- + 500 word essay
- + Word processed and double spaced
- + Size 12, Times New Roman font
- + Name, address, phone number, e-mail, school and grade must appear on a cover sheet, not on the essay
- + Must be a recognized medical disease, disorder, or condition medical professionals.
- + Must contain researched material and data
- + All research data must be cited, and a work cited page must be attached to the essay.
- + You cannot apply if you are a previous winner of this award
- + Submission deadline: Friday, July 31st, 2009 by 7pm
